



## The steepest homestretch in Japan – for even greater thrills as the race reaches its climax.

Nakayama Racecourse – home of our Grand Prix Arima Kinen, a nationally popular year-end event – was refurbished in 2014. One of the new features is “Grand Prix Road,” a spot for spectators to feel the horses’ breath and see the jockeys from up close! Enjoy the thrill of the race as the runners battle up the famous slope of the homestretch, or up and down of the steeplechase course.



### Christmas tree

In December, a gigantic Christmas tree decorated with some 40,000 illuminated lights color the night sky, making it another famous feature of Nakayama Racecourse.



### Steeplechase Races

The steeplechase course is one of the most difficult in Japan. Both the Nakayama Daishogai and Nakayama Grand Jump are GI races held at this racecourse.



### Reserved seating

Five types of reserved seating (including “gondola seats” for a more relaxed view of the action), senior seating and wheelchair spaces are also provided.

### Cherry trees

Cherry trees line the backstretch up to the 4th corner, adding color to the racing action. In spring each year, the Satsuki Sho is held with cherry blossoms in full bloom.

### Shopping and Leisure

The Chiba Prefecture bayshore area offers convenient access from outside the prefecture, and is home to a number of major retail outlets – LaLaport Tokyo Bay, Ikea Funabashi, Aeon Mall Makuhari New City and Costco Wholesale Makuhari, to name but a few. The area also boasts numerous leisure facilities, including the massive Tokyo Disney Resort with its two theme parks, the Oedo Onsen Monogatari / Urayasu Mangekyo hot spring facility with classic Japanese character, and the Makuhari Messe event halls and international exhibition center.

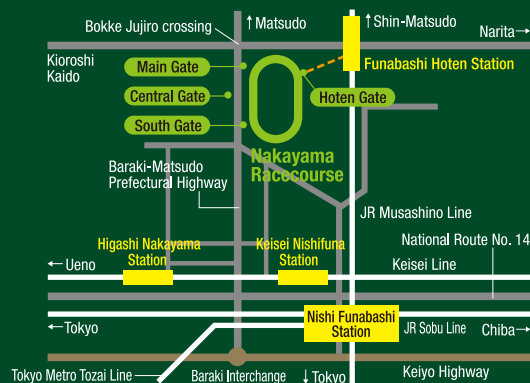

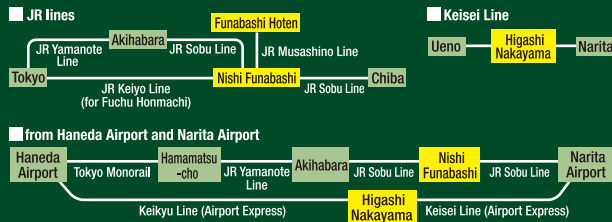

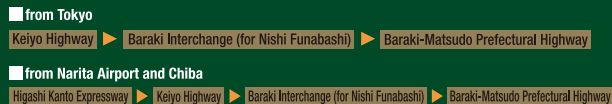

**(Access)** 15 minutes by bus, 30 minutes on foot from Nishi Funabashi Station on the JR Sobu Line, JR Keiyo Line and Tokyo Metro Tozai Line / 10 mins. on foot using the special underpass (“Nakki Mall”) from Funabashi Hoten Station on the JR Musashino Line / 10 minutes by bus, 20 minutes on foot from Higashi Nakayama Station on the Keisei Line  
**(Admission)** 200 yen (free for under 15’s)  
**(Gates open)** 09:00 (subject to change depending on congestion levels, etc.)

### Betting points

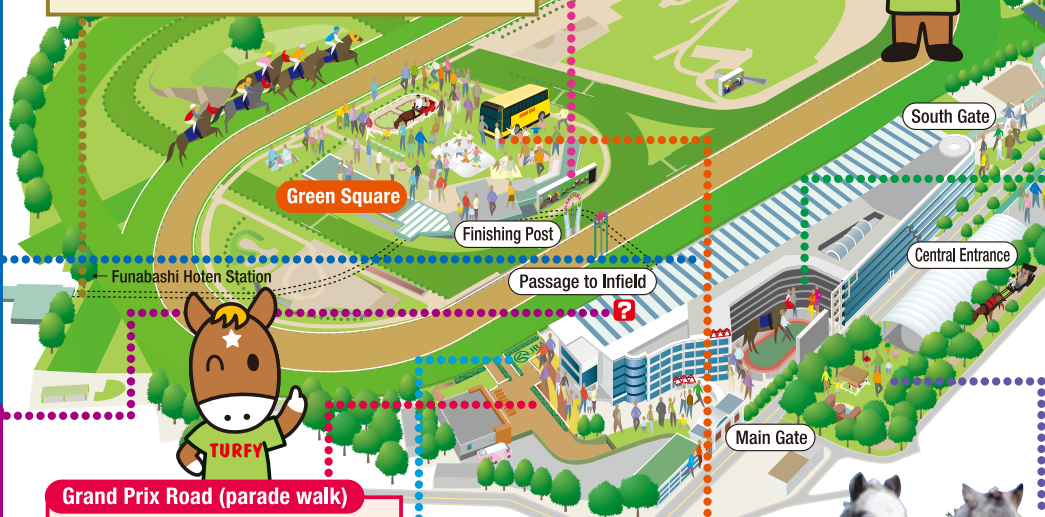
### Main Information
